



語音撥號

2. 捲動至需要的中文字元,選擇確認。

詞組輸入

可以一次輸入一個不超過七個中文字元的詞組。

- 1. 按相應的數字鍵以輸入詞組第一個字元的音節或拼音 首字母,或者前幾個筆劃。
- 2. 按 0 可輸入分隔符號;或者,在拼音模式下,重複按 1 可輸入字元的聲調標記。
- 3. 輸入下一個中文字元的音節或拼音首字母,或者前幾個筆劃。
- 4. 如有必要,重複步驟 2 及 3,輸入詞組中所有字元的音節或拼音首字母,或者前幾個筆劃。
- 5. 在拼音模式下,如有需要,重複按*鍵可突出顯示您想要的拼音組合。

Insert a microSD card





Switch the phone on and off

To switch the phone on or off, press and hold the power key.

If the phone prompts for a PIN code, enter the code (displayed as ****).

If the phone prompts you for the time and date, enter the local time, select the time zone of your location in terms of the time difference with respect to Greenwich Mean

Get started


Time (GMT), and enter the date. See "Date and time", p. 39.

When you switch on your phone for the first time, you may be prompted to get the configuration settings from your service provider (network service). For more information, refer to **Connect to support**. See "Configuration", p. 41. and "Configuration setting service". p. 9.

Standby mode

When the phone is ready for use, and you have not entered any characters, the phone is in the standby mode.

Display

You may change the function of the left and right selection key. See "Left and right selection keys", p. 39.

Active standby

The active standby mode displays a list of selected phone features and information that you can directly access.

To activate or deactivate the active standby mode, select Menu > Settings > Display > Active standby > Active standby mode.

In the active standby mode, scroll up or down to navigate in the list, and choose **Select** or **View**. The arrows indicate that further information is available. To stop navigation, select **Exit**.

To organise and change the active standby mode, select **Options** and from the available options.

Shortcuts in the standby mode

To access a list of numbers you have dialled, press the call key once. To call a number from the list, scroll to the number or name, and press the call key.

To open the web browser, press and hold **0**.

To call your voice mailbox, press and hold 1.

You can use keys as shortcuts. See "Dialling shortcuts", p. 19.

Indicators

- You have unread messages.
- You have unsent, cancelled, or failed messages.
- You have missed calls.
- The keypad is locked.
- The phone does not ring for an incoming calls or text messages.
- An alarm is set.
- **G**/E The phone is registered to the GPRS or EGPRS network.
- / The phone has an open GPRS or EGPRS connection.
- $\boxed{6}$ / \swarrow The GPRS or EGPRS connection is suspended (on hold).
- Bluetooth is turned on.
- 2 If you have two phone lines, the second phone line is selected.
- All incoming calls are diverted to another number.
- Calls are limited to a closed user group.

The currently active profile is timed.

Flight mode

Use the flight mode in radio sensitive environments—on board aircraft or in hospitals—to deactivate all radio frequency functions. You still have access to offline games, the calendar, and phone numbers. When the flight mode is active, ———— is displayed.

To activate or set up the flight mode, select Menu > Settings > Profiles > Flight > Activate or Personalise.

To deactivate the flight mode, select any other profile.

Make an emergency call in flight mode

Enter the emergency number, press the call key, and when **Exit flight profile?** is displayed, select **Yes**.

Warning: With the flight profile you cannot make or receive any calls, including emergency calls, or use other features that require network coverage. To make calls, you must first activate the phone function by changing profiles. If the device has been locked, enter the lock code. If you need to make an emergency call while the device is locked and in the flight profile, you may be also able to enter an official emergency number programmed in your device in the lock code field and select 'Call'. The device will confirm that you are about to exit flight profile to start an emergency call.

Get started

Keypad lock

To lock the keypad to prevent accidental keypresses, select **Menu**, and press * within 3.5 seconds.

To unlock the keypad, select **Unlock**, and press * within 1.5 seconds. If requested, enter the lock code.

To answer a call when the keypad is locked, press the call key. When you end or reject the call, the keypad locks automatically.

Further features are **Automatic keyguard** and **Security keyguard**. See "Phone", p. 40.

When the device or keypad is locked, calls may be possible to the official emergency number programmed into your device.

Functions without a SIM card

Some functions of your phone may be used without inserting a SIM card, such as Organiser functions and games. Some functions appear dimmed in the menus and cannot be used.

3. Calls

Make a call

You can start a call in several ways:

- Enter the phone number, including the area code, and press the call key.
 - For international calls, press * twice for the international prefix (the + character replaces the international access code), enter the country code, the area code without the leading 0, if necessary, and the phone number.
- To access the list of dialled numbers, press the call key once in the standby mode. Select a number or name, and press the call key.
- Search for a name or phone number that you saved in Contacts. See "Manage contacts", p. 31.

To adjust the volume in a call, press the volume key up or down.

Incoming call

To answer an incoming call, press the call key. To end the call, press the end key.

To reject an incoming call, press the end key. To mute the ringing tone, select **Silence**.

Dialling shortcuts

First assign a phone number to one of the number keys, 2 to 9. See "Assign dialling shortcuts", p. 32.

Use a dialling shortcut to make a call in one of the following ways:

- Press a number key, then the call key.
- If Menu > Settings > Call > Speed dialling > On is selected, press and hold a number key.

Voice dialling

Make a phone call by saying the name that is saved in Contacts.

As voice commands are language-dependent, before voice dialling, you must select Menu > Settings > Phone > Language settings > Recognition lang. and your language.

Note: Using voice tags may be difficult in a noisy environment or during an emergency, so you should not rely solely upon voice dialling in all circumstances.

 In the standby mode, press and hold the right selection key or the volume down key. A short tone sounds, and Speak now is displayed.

Calls

Speak the name of the contact you want to dial. If the voice recognition is successful, a list with matches is shown. The phone plays the voice command of the first match on the list. If it is not the correct command, scroll to another entry.

Warning: Do not hold the device near your ear when the loudspeaker is in use, because the volume may be extremely loud.

Options during a call

Many of the options that you can use during a call are network services. For availability, contact your service provider.

During a call, select **Options**. The available options may include the following:

Call options are Mute or Unmute, Contacts, Menu, Lock keypad, Record, Voice clarity, Loudspeaker or Handset.

Network options are **Answer** or **Reject**, **Hold** or **Unhold**, **New call**, **Add to conference**, **End call**, **End all calls**, and the following:

- Send DTMF to send tone strings
- Swap to switch between the active call and the call on hold
- Transfer to connect a call on hold to an active call and disconnect yourself
- **Conference** to make a conference call
- Private call to have a private discussion in a conference call

4. Chinese input

The input methods available in the phone are preset according to the market where it will be sold.

When **Writing language** is set to traditional Chinese, you can input traditional Chinese characters with the stroke input method. When **Writing language** is set to simplified Chinese, you can input simplified Chinese characters with the pinyin or stroke input method.

To change the writing language when writing text, press and hold #, and select **Writing language** and the desired language.

Switch between input methods

Input method indicators are shown at the top of the display:

Pinyin	pinyin

Uppercase	ABC Abc

Number input	129

Not all the methods may be available in all circumstances. Always check the indicator to see which input method is in use.

To switch between the available input methods, press # repeatedly, until the indicator of the desired input method is displayed.

Pinyin input method Pinyin input

The pinyin symbols are printed on the number keys. You only need to press a key once, regardless of the position of the symbol on the number key. The phone makes logical combinations of the pinyin symbols.

To input a character using the pinyin input method:

- Press the number key once for each pinyin symbol you want to input (use "v" for "u").
- 2. Press 1 repeatedly until you get the desired tone mark.
- 3. If necessary, press * repeatedly to highlight the desired pinyin combination.
- 4. Scroll to the desired Chinese character, and select **OK**.

Ambiguous Pinyin

With this feature, your phone will tolerate ambiguity of certain pinyin pairs: c/ch, z/zh, s/sh, n/l, r/l, f/h, an/ang, in/ing, and en/eng. To select which ambiguous pinyin pairs to use, when no input symbol or prediction list is displayed, select **Options** > **Ambiguous pinyin**.

Stroke input method

The strokes constituting Chinese characters have been divided into five categories: horizontal, vertical, left-falling, dot, and turning. Each category corresponds to a number key from 1 to 5, respectively.

The strokes are classified according to the following table:

standard stroke order, press the number keys to input the strokes.

If you are not sure which stroke to use or which category it belongs to, press **6** to substitute that stroke, then continue with the subsequent strokes. A question mark appears in the input area to represent that stroke.

2. Scroll to the desired Chinese character, and select **OK**.

Phrase input

You may input a phrase of no more than seven Chinese characters at a time.

- Press the relevant number keys to enter the syllable or pinyin initial, or first strokes for the first character of the phrase.
- Press 0 to enter a separator; or, if in the pinyin mode, press 1 repeatedly to enter the tone mark of the character.
- 3. Enter the syllable or pinyin initial, or first strokes of the next Chinese character.
- Repeat step 2 and 3, if necessary, to enter the syllables or pinyin initials, or first strokes of all the characters in the phrase.
- 5. If in the pinyin mode, press * repeatedly, if necessary, to highlight the pinyin combination you want.
- Scroll through the candidate list to the desired phrase, and select **OK**.

Not all phrases are stored in your phone. To create a phrase of no more than seven characters, when no input symbol or prediction list is displayed, select **Options** > **User phrases** > **Add**. When the database becomes full, the new phrase replaces the phrase that has not been accessed for the longest time.

Use a separator to separate pinyin strings for syllables of different characters or the strokes of different characters. When you enter a separator, the phone predicts characters or character strings that can form a phrase with the possible candidates of the combination of pinyin or stroke strings and separators, if any, that you have entered.

Set predictive English on or off

When writing text in English, to switch predictive text input on or off, press and hold #, and select **Prediction** on or **Prediction off**.

Traditional text input

Press a number key, **2** to **9**, repeatedly until the desired character appears. The available characters depend on the selected writing language.

If the next letter you want is located on the same key as the present one, wait until the cursor appears and enter the letter.

To access the most common punctuation marks and special characters, repeatedly press the number key 1 or press * to select a special character.

Predictive text input

Predictive text input is based on a built-in dictionary to which you can also add new words.

- Start writing a word, using the keys 2 to 9. Press each key only once for one letter.
- 2. To confirm a word, scroll right or add a space.
 - If the word is not correct, press * repeatedly, and select the word from the list.
 - If the? character is displayed after the word, the word you intended to write is not in the dictionary.
 To add the word to the dictionary, select Spell.
 Enter the word using traditional text input, and select Save.
 - To write compound words, enter the first part of the word, and scroll right to confirm it. Write the last part of the word, and confirm the word.
- 3. Start writing the next word.

Writing text tips

The following functions may also be available for writing text:

- To insert a number when no input symbol is displayed, press and hold the desired number key.
- To insert a space when there is no candidate or prediction list displayed, press 0.
- To enter a special character after you have finished entering a word or character, press *.

Chinese input

- To repeat a character to the left of the cursor in the editing window, press and hold *.
- To end the Chinese character prediction, select **Back**, or press the relevant keys to start entering new text.

5. Navigate the menus

The phone offers you an extensive range of functions that are grouped into menus.

- 1. To access the menu, select Menu.
- Scroll through the menu, and select an option (for example, Settings).
- If the selected menu contains further submenus, select one (for example, Call).
- If the selected menu contains further submenus, repeat step 3.
- 5. Select the setting of your choice.
- To return to the previous menu level, select Back.To exit the menu. select Exit.

To change the menu view, select **Options** > **Main menu view** > **List, Grid, Grid with labels,** or **Tab.**

To rearrange the menu, scroll to the menu to be moved, and select **Options** > **Organise** > **Move**. Scroll to where you want to move the menu, and select **OK**. To save the change, select **Done** > **Yes**.

6. Messaging

You can read, write, send and save text and multimedia messages, e-mail, audio and flash messages. The messaging services can only be used if they are supported by your network or service provider.

Text and multimedia messages

You can create a message and optionally attach, for example, a picture. Your phone automatically changes a text message to a multimedia message when a file is attached.

Text messages

Your device supports text messages beyond the limit for a single message. Longer messages are sent as two or more messages. Your service provider may charge accordingly. Characters with accents or other marks, and characters from some language options, take up more space, and limit the number of characters that can be sent in a single message.

An indicator at the top of the display shows the total number of characters left and the number of messages needed for sending.

Before you can send any text or SMS e-mail messages, you must save your message centre number. Select Menu > Messaging > Message settings > Text messages >

Message centres > **Add centre**, enter a name, and the number from the service provider.

Multimedia messages

A multimedia message can contain text, pictures, sound clips, and video clips.

Only devices that have compatible features can receive and display multimedia messages. The appearance of a message may vary depending on the receiving device.

The wireless network may limit the size of MMS messages. If the inserted picture exceeds this limit the device may make it smaller so that it can be sent by MMS.

Important: Exercise caution when opening messages. Messages may contain malicious software or otherwise be harmful to your device or PC.

To check the availability of, and to subscribe to the multimedia messaging service (MMS), contact your service provider. You also may also download the configuration settings. See "Nokia support", p. 10.

Create a text or multimedia message

Select Menu > Messaging > Create message > Message.

- To add recipients, scroll to the To: field, and enter the recipient's number or e-mail address, or select Add to select recipients from the available options. Select Options to add recipients and subjects and to set sending options.
- 3. Scroll to the **Text:** field, and enter the message text.
- 4. To attach content to the message, scroll to the attachment bar at the bottom of the display and select the desired type of content.
- 5. To send the message, press Send.

The message type is indicated at the top of the display and changes automatically depending on the content of the message.

Service providers may charge differently depending on the message type. Check with your service provider for details.

Read a message and reply

Important: Exercise caution when opening messages. Messages may contain malicious software or otherwise be harmful to your device or PC.

Your phone issues a notification when you receive a message. Select **View** to display the message. If more than one message was received, to display a message, select the message from the Inbox and **Open**. Use the scroll key to view all parts of the message.

To create an answer message, select **Reply**.

Send messages Message sending

To send the message, select **Send**. The phone saves the message in the **Outbox** folder, and the sending starts.

Note: The message sent icon or text on your device screen does not indicate that the message is received at the intended destination.

If message sending is interrupted, the phone tries to resend the message a few times. If these attempts fail, the message remains in the **Outbox** folder. To cancel the sending of the messages in the **Outbox** folder, select **Options** > **Cancel sending**.

To save the sent messages in the **Sent items** folder, select **Menu > Messaging > Message settings > General settings > Save sent messages**.

Organise your messages

The phone saves received messages in the **Inbox** folder. Organise your messages in the saved items folder.

To add, rename, or delete a folder, select Menu > Messaging > Saved items > Options.

E-mail

Access your POP3 or IMAP4 e-mail account with your phone to read, write and send e-mail. This e-mail application is different from the SMS e-mail function.

Messaging

Before you can use e-mail, you must have an e-mail account and the correct settings. To check the availability and the settings of your e-mail account, contact your e-mail service provider. You may receive the e-mail configuration settings as a configuration message. See "Configuration setting service", p. 9.

E-mail setup wizard

The e-mail setup wizard starts automatically if no e-mail settings are defined in the phone. To start the setup wizard for an additional e-mail account, select **Menu** > **Messaging** and the existing e-mail account. Select **Options** > **Add mailbox** to start the e-mail setup wizard. Follow the instructions on the display.

Write and send an e-mail

You may write your e-mail before connecting to the e-mail service.

- Select Menu > Messaging > Create message > Email message.
- 2. If more than one e-mail account is defined, select the account from which you want to send the e-mail.
- Enter the recipient's e-mail address, the subject, and the e-mail message. To attach a file, select **Options** > **Insert** and from the available options.
- 4. To send the e-mail, select **Send**.

Read an e-mail and reply

Important: Exercise caution when opening messages. Messages may contain malicious software or otherwise be harmful to your device or PC.

- To download e-mail message headers, select Menu > Messaging and your e-mail account.
- 2. To download an e-mail and its attachments, select the e-mail and **Open** or **Retrieve**.
- To reply to or forward the e-mail, select **Options** and from the available options.
- To disconnect from your e-mail account, select
 Options > Disconnect. The connection to the e-mail account automatically ends after some time without activity.

New e-mail notifications

Your phone can automatically check your e-mail account in time intervals and issue a notification when new e-mail is received.

- Select Menu > Messaging > Message settings > E-mail messages > Edit mailboxes.
- Select your e-mail account, **Downloading sett.**, and the following options:
 - Mailbox upd. interval to set how often your phone checks your e-mail account for new e-mail
 - Automatic retrieval to retrieve new e-mail automatically from your e-mail account

To enable the new e-mail notification, select Menu > Messaging > Message settings > E-mail messages > New e-mail notif. > On.

Flash messages

Flash messages are text messages that are instantly displayed upon reception.

- To write a flash message, select Menu > Messaging > Create message > Flash message.
- Enter the recipient's phone number, write your message (maximum 70 characters), and select Send.

Nokia Xpress audio messages

Create and send an audio message using MMS in a convenient way.

- Select Menu > Messaging > Create message > Audio message. The voice recorder opens.
- 2. Record your message. See "Voice recorder", p. 49.
- Enter one or more phone numbers in the To: field, or select Add to retrieve a number.
- 4. To send the message, select **Send**.

Instant messaging

With instant messaging (IM, network service) you can send short text messages to online users. You must subscribe to a service and register with the IM service you want to use. Check the availability of this service, pricing, and instructions with your service provider. The menus may vary depending on your IM provider.

To connect to the service, select **Menu** > **Messaging** > **IMs** and follow the instructions on the display.

Info messages, SIM messages, and service commands

Info messages

You can receive messages on various topics from your service provider (network service). For more information, contact your service provider.

Select **Menu** > **Messaging** > **Info messages** and from the available options.

Service commands

Service commands allow you to write and send service requests (USSD commands) to your service provider, such as activation commands for network services.

To write and send the service request, select **Menu > Messaging > Serv. commands.** For details, contact your service provider.

SIM messages

SIM messages are specific text messages that are saved to your SIM card. You can copy or move those messages from the SIM to the phone memory, but not vice versa.

To read SIM messages, select Menu > Messaging > Options > SIM messages.

Messaging

Voice messages

The voice mailbox is a network service to which you may need to subscribe. For more information, contact your service provider.

To call your voice mailbox, press and hold 1.

To edit your voice mailbox number, select Menu > Messaging > Voice messages > Voice mailbox no..

Message settings

Select **Menu** > **Messaging** > **Message settings** and from the following:

- General settings to save copies of sent messages in your phone, to overwrite old messages if the message memory becomes full, and to set up other preferences related to messages
- Text messages to allow delivery reports, to set up message centres for SMS and SMS e-mail, to select the type of character support, and to set up other preferences related to text messages
- Multimedia messages to allow delivery reports, to set up the appearance of multimedia messages, to allow the reception of multimedia messages and advertisements, and to set up other preferences related to multimedia messages
- E-mail messages to allow e-mail reception, to set the image size in e-mail, and to set up other preferences related to e-mail
- Service messages to activate service messages and to set up preferences related to service messages

7. Contacts

You can save names, phone numbers as contacts in the phone memory and on the SIM card memory and search and recall them to make a phone call or to send a message.

The phone functions that display names use the phone number that most closely matches. If less than 7 digits match, the name displayed may not be correct.

Manage contacts

Select the memory for contacts

The phone memory can save contacts with additional details, such as various phone numbers and text items. You can also save an image, a tone, or a video clip for a limited number of contacts.

The SIM card memory can save names with one phone number attached to them. The contacts saved in the SIM card memory are indicated by <a>[

Select Menu > Contacts > Settings > Memory in use. When you select Phone and SIM, contacts will be saved in the phone memory.

Save names and numbers

To save a name and phone number, select **Menu** > **Contacts** > **Names** > **Options** > **Add new contact.**

The first number you save is automatically set as the default number and is indicated with a frame around the

number type indicator (for example,). When you select a name from contacts (for example, to make a call), the default number is used unless you select another number.

Search for a contact

Select **Menu** > **Contacts** > **Names**, and scroll through the list of contacts, or enter the first characters of the contact's name.

Search for a contact

To search for a contact, select **Menu** > **Contacts** > **Names** > **Options** > **Search**. Enter the first characters of the name, and select **Search**.

To search for a contact with the pop-up window, in the standby mode, scroll down to highlight the first name (or number). Enter the first input symbol of the name you search for. The symbol is displayed in a pop-up window. You may enter more symbols in the pop-up window. The matching names are displayed. The names may not be listed in the same order as in **Names**.

To change the input method when you search for a contact, press #.

Add and edit details

To add or change a detail to a contact, select the contact and **Details** > **Options** > **Add detail** and from the available options.

Contacts

Copy or move a contact between the SIM card and phone memory

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts > Names.
- Select the contact to copy or move and **Options** > **Copy contact** or **Move contact**.

Copy or move several contacts between the SIM card and phone memory

- Select the first contact to copy or move and **Options** > Mark.
- Mark the other contacts, and select Options > Copy marked or Move marked.

Copy or move all contacts between the SIM card and phone memory

Select Menu > Contacts > Copy contacts or Move contacts.

Delete contacts

Select the contact and **Options** > **Delete contact**.

To delete all the contacts from the phone or SIM card memory, select Menu > Contacts > Del. all contacts > From phone memory or From SIM card.

To delete a number, text item, or an image attached to the contact, search for the contact, and select **Details**. Scroll to the desired detail, and select **Options** > **Delete** and from the available options.

Create a contact group

Arrange contacts into caller groups with different ringing tones and group images.

- 1. Select Menu > Contacts > Groups.
- To create a new group, select Add or Options > Add new group.
- Enter the group name, select an image and a ringing tone if you want to add them to the group, and select Save.
- Select the group and View > Add to add contacts to the group.

Business cards

You can send and receive a person's contact information from a compatible device that supports the vCard standard.

To send a business card, search for the contact, and select **Details** > **Options** > **Send business card**.

When you receive a business card, select **Show** > **Save** to save the business card in the phone memory.

Assign dialling shortcuts

Create shortcuts by assigning phone numbers to the number keys 2-9.

 Select Menu > Contacts > Speed dials, and scroll to a number key.

Contacts

- 2. Select **Assign**, or, if a number has already been assigned to the key, select **Options** > **Change**.
- 3. Enter a number or search for a contact.

8. Call log

To view the information on your calls, messages, data, and synchronisation, select **Menu** > **Log** and from the available options.

Note: The actual invoice for calls and services from your service provider may vary, depending on network features, rounding off for billing, taxes, and so forth.

9. Position log

The network may send you a position request (network service). Contact your service provider to subscribe and to agree upon the delivery of positioning information.

To accept or reject the position request, select **Accept** or **Reject**. If you miss the request, the phone automatically accepts or rejects it according to what you have agreed with your network operator or service provider.

To view the information on the 10 most recent privacy notifications and requests, select Menu > Log > Positioning > Position log.

10. Connectivity

Your phone provides several features to connect to other devices to transmit and receive data.

Bluetooth wireless technology

Bluetooth technology allows you to connect your phone, using radio waves, to a compatible Bluetooth device within 10 metres (32 feet).

This device is compliant with Bluetooth Specification 2.0 + EDR supporting the following profiles: 2.0 + EDR generic access, hands-free, headset, object push, file transfer, dial-up networking, serial port, generic object exchange, advanced audio distribution, audio video remote control, and generic audio video distribution. To ensure interoperability between other devices supporting Bluetooth technology, use Nokia approved enhancements for this model. Check with the manufacturers of other devices to determine their compatibility with this device.

Features using Bluetooth technology increase the demand on battery power and reduce the battery life.

Set up a Bluetooth connection

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Connectivity** > **Bluetooth** and take the following steps:

 Select My phone's name and enter a name for your phone.

- To activate Bluetooth connectivity select Bluetooth > On.
 Indicates that Bluetooth is active.
- To connect your phone with an audio enhancement, select Connect audio enhan. and the device that you want to connect to.
- To pair your phone with any Bluetooth device in range, select Paired devices > Add new device.

Scroll to a found device, and select Add.

Enter a passcode (up to 16 characters) on your phone and allow the connection on the other Bluetooth device.

If you are concerned about security, turn off the Bluetooth function, or set **My phone's visibility** to **Hidden**. Accept Bluetooth communication only from those you trust.

PC connection to the internet

Use Bluetooth technology to connect your compatible PC to the internet without PC Suite software. Your phone must have activated a service provider that supports internet access, and your PC has to support Bluetooth personal area network (PAN). After connecting to the network access point (NAP) service of the phone, and pairing with your PC, your phone automatically opens a packet data connection to the internet.

Packet data

General packet radio service (GPRS) is a network service that allows mobile phones to send and receive data over an internet protocol (IP)-based network.

To define how to use the service, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Connectivity** > **Packet data** > **Packet data conn.** and from the following options:

- When needed to set the packet data connection to established when required by an application. The connection will be cut when the application is closed.
- Always online to automatically connect to a packet data network when you switch the phone on

You can use your phone as a modem by connecting it to a compatible PC using Bluetooth technology or a USB data cable. For details, see Nokia PC Suite documentation. See "Nokia support", p. 10.

USB data cable

You can use the USB data cable to transfer data between the phone and a compatible PC or a printer supporting PictBridge.

To activate the phone for data transfer or image printing, connect the data cable and select the mode:

- PC Suite to use the cable for PC Suite
- Printing & media to use the phone with a PictBridge compatible printer or with a compatible PC
- Data storage to connect to a PC that does not have Nokia software and use the phone as data storage

To change the USB mode, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Connectivity** > **USB data cable** and the desired USB mode.

Synchronisation and backup

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Sync and backup** and from the following:

- Phone switch Synchronise or copy selected data between your phone and another phone using Bluetooth technology.
- Create backup Create a backup of selected data to the memory card or to an external device.
- Restore backup Select a backup file stored on the memory card or on an external device and restore it to the phone. Select Options > Details for information about the selected backup file.
- Data transfer Synchronise or copy selected data between your phone and another device, PC, or network server (network service).

Nokia PC Suite

With Nokia PC Suite, you can manage your music, synchronise contacts, calendar, notes, and to-do notes between your phone and a compatible PC or a remote internet server (network service). You may find more information and PC Suite on the Nokia website. See "Nokia support", p. 10.

11. Settings

Profiles

Your phone has various setting groups called profiles, which you can customise with ringing tones for different events and environments.

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Profiles**, the desired profile, and from the following options:

- Activate to activate the selected profile
- **Personalise** to change the profile settings
- Timed to set the profile to be active for a certain time. When the time set for the profile expires, the previous profile that was not timed becomes active.

Themes

A theme contains elements for personalising your phone. Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Themes** and from the following options:

- Select theme Open the Themes folder, and select a theme.
- Theme downloads Open a list of links to download more themes.

Tones

You can change the tone settings of the selected active profile.

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Tones**. You can find the same settings in the **Profiles** menu.

If you select the highest ringing tone level, the ringing tone reaches its highest level after a few seconds.

Lights

To activate or deactivate light effects associated with different phone functions, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Lights**.

Display

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Display** and from the available options:

- Wallpaper to add a background image for the standby mode
- Active standby to activate, organise, and personalise the active standby mode
- Standby font colour to select the font colour for the standby mode
- Navigation key icons to display the icons of the scroll key shortcuts in the standby mode when active standby is off
- Notification details to display details in missed call and message notifications
- Transition effects to activate a smoother and more organic navigation experience

- Screen saver to create and set a screen saver
- Font size to set the font size for messaging, contacts, and web pages
- Operator logo to display the operator logo
- Cell info display to display the cell identity, if available from the network

Date and time

To change the clock type, time, time zone, or date, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Date and time**.

When travelling to a different time zone, select Menu > Settings > Date and time > Date & time settings > Time zone:, and scroll left or right to select the time zone of your location. The time and date are set according to the time zone and enable your phone to display the correct sending time of received text or multimedia messages.

For example, GMT +8 denotes the time zone for HK.

My shortcuts

With personal shortcuts you get quick access to often used functions of the phone.

Left and right selection keys

To change the function assigned to the left or right selection key, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **My**

shortcuts > Left selection key or Right selection key and the function.

In the standby mode, if the left selection key is **Go to**, to activate a function, select **Go to** > **Options** and from the following options:

- **Select options** to add or remove a function
- **Organise** to rearrange the functions

Other shortcuts

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **My shortcuts** and from the following options:

- Navigation key to assign other functions from a predefined list to the navigation key (scroll key).
- Active standby key to select the movement of the navigation key to activate the active standby mode

Call

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Call** and from the following options:

- Call divert to divert your incoming calls (network service). You may not be able to divert your calls if some call barring functions are active. <u>See</u> "Security", p. 41.
- Anykey answer to answer an incoming call by briefly pressing any key, except the power key, the left and right selection keys, or the end key
- Automatic redial to automatically redial the number if a call fails. The phone tries to call the number 10 times.

Settings

- Voice clarity to enhance speech intelligibility, especially in noisy environments
- Speed dialling to dial the names and phone numbers assigned to the number keys (2 to 9) by pressing and holding the corresponding number key
- Call waiting to have the network notify you of an incoming call while you have a call in progress (network service)
- Call duration display Select On to display the duration of the call in progress
- Summary after call to briefly display the approximate duration after each call
- Send my caller ID to show your phone number to the person you are calling (network service). To use the setting agreed upon with your service provider, select Set by network.
- Outgoing call line to select the phone line for making calls, if your SIM card supports multiple phone lines (network service)

Phone

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Phone** and from the following options:

- Language settings To set the display language of your phone, select Phone language. Automatic selects the language according to the information on the SIM card. To set a language for the voice commands, select Recognition lang.
- Memory status to check the memory consumption

- Automatic keyguard to lock the keypad automatically after a preset time delay when the phone is in the standby mode and no function has been used.
- Security keyguard to ask for the security code when you unlock the keyguard
- **Voice recognition** <u>See "Voice commands"</u>, p. 40.
- Flight query to be asked whether to use the flight mode when you switch the phone on. With the flight mode, all radio connections are switched off.
- Operator selection to set a cellular network available in your area
- Help text activation to select whether the phone shows help texts
- Start-up tone to play a tone when you switch the phone on
- Confirm SIM actions <u>See "SIM services"</u>, p. 56.

Voice commands

Call contacts and use your phone by speaking a voice command.

Voice commands are language-dependent. To set the language, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Phone** > **Language settings** > **Recognition lang.** and your language.

To train the voice recognition of your phone to your voice, select Menu > Settings > Phone > Voice recognition > Voice recog. training.

To activate a voice command for a function, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Phone** > **Voice recognition** > **Voice commands**, a feature, and the function. indicates that the voice command is activated.

To activate the voice command, select **Add**. To play the activated voice command, select **Play**.

To use voice commands, see "Voice dialling", p. 19.

To manage the voice commands, scroll to a function, and select **Options** and from the following:

- Edit or Remove to rename or deactivate the voice command
- Add all or Remove all to activate or deactivate voice commands for all functions in the voice commands list

Enhancements

This menu and its various options are shown only if the phone is or has been connected to a compatible mobile enhancement.

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Enhancements**. Select an enhancement, and an option depending on the enhancement.

Configuration

You can configure your phone with settings that are required for certain services. Your service provider may also send you these settings. See "Configuration setting service", p. 9.

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Configuration** and from the following options:

- Default config. sett. to view the service providers saved in the phone and set a default service provider
- Act. def. in all apps. to activate the default configuration settings for supported applications
- Preferred access pt. to view the saved access points
- Connect to support to download the configuration settings from your service provider
- Personal config. sett. to manually add new personal accounts for various services and to activate or delete them. To add a new personal account, select Add, or Options > Add new. Select the service type, and enter the required parameters. To activate a personal account, scroll to it, and select Options > Activate.

Security

When security features that restrict calls are in use (such as call barring, closed user group, and fixed dialling), calls may be possible to the official emergency number programmed into your device.

Select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Security** and from the following options:

 PIN code request or UPIN code request — to request for your PIN or UPIN code every time the phone is switched on. Some SIM cards do not allow the code request to be turned off.

Settings

- PIN2 code request to select whether the PIN2 code is required when using a specific phone feature which is protected by the PIN2 code. Some SIM cards do not allow the code request to be turned off.
- Call barring service to restrict incoming calls to and outgoing calls from your phone (network service).
 A barring password is required.
- **Fixed dialling** to restrict your outgoing calls to selected phone numbers if supported by your SIM card. When the fixed dialling is on, GPRS connections are not possible except while sending text messages over a GPRS connection. In this case, the recipient's phone number and the message centre number must be included in the fixed dialling list.
- Closed user group to specify a group of people whom you can call and who can call you (network service)
- Security level Select Phone to request the security code whenever a new SIM card is inserted into the phone. Select Memory, to request the security code when the SIM card memory is selected, and you want to change the memory in use.
- Access codes to change the security code, PIN code, UPIN code, PIN2 code, or barring password
- Code in use to select whether the PIN code or UPIN code should be active
- Authority certificates or User certificates to view the list of the authority or user certificates downloaded into your phone. See "Browser security", p. 51.

 Security module sett. — to view Secur. module details, activate Module PIN request, or change the module PIN and signing PIN. See "Access codes", p. 9.

Restore factory settings

To restore the phone back to factory conditions, select **Menu** > **Settings** > **Rest. factory sett.** and from the following options:

- Restore settings only to reset all preference settings without deleting any personal data
- Restore all to reset all preference settings and delete all personal data, such as contacts, messages, media files, and activation keys

12. Operator menu

Access a portal to services provided by your network operator. For more information, contact your network operator. The operator can update this menu with a service message.

13. Gallery

Manage images, video clips, music files, themes, graphics, tones, recordings, and received files. These files are stored in the phone memory or on a memory card and may be arranged in folders.

Folders and files

To view the list of folders, select **Menu** > **Gallery**. To view the list of files in a folder, select a folder and **Open**. To view the folders of the memory card when moving a file, scroll to the memory card, and press the scroll key right.

Print images

Your phone supports Nokia XpressPrint to print images that are in the jpeg format.

- To connect your phone to a compatible printer, use a data cable or send the image by Bluetooth to a printer supporting Bluetooth technology. <u>See "Bluetooth</u> <u>wireless technology"</u>, p. 36.
- Select the image you want to print and **Options** > **Print**.

Memory card

Use a memory card to store your multimedia files, such as video clips, music tracks, sound files, images, and messaging data.

Some of the folders in **Gallery** with content that the phone uses (for example, **Themes**) may be stored on the memory card.

Format the memory card

Some supplied memory cards are preformatted; others require formatting. When you format a memory card, all data on the card is permanently lost.

- To format a memory card, select Menu > Gallery or Applications, the memory card folder , and Options > Format mem. card > Yes.
- When formatting is complete, enter a name for the memory card.

Lock the memory card

To set a password (maximum 8 characters) to lock your memory card against unauthorised use, select the memory card folder and Options > Set password.

The password is stored in your phone, and you do not have to enter it again while you are using the memory card on the same phone. If you want to use the memory card on another device, you are asked for the password.

To remove the password, select **Options** > **Delete password**.

Check memory consumption

To check the memory consumption of different data groups and the available memory to install new software on your memory card, select the memory card and **Options** > **Details**.

14. Media

Camera and video

Take pictures or record video clips with the built-in camera.

Take a picture

To use the still picture function, select **Menu** > **Media** > **Camera**; or, if the video function is on, scroll left or right.

To zoom in and out in the camera mode, scroll up and down or press the volume keys.

To take a picture, select **Capture**. The phone saves the pictures on the memory card, if available, or in the phone memory.

To display a picture immediately after you take it, select **Options** > **Settings** > **Image preview time** and the preview time. During the preview time, select **Back** to take another picture, or **Send** to send the picture as a multimedia message.

Your device supports an image capture resolution of $1600x1200\ \text{pixels}$.

Record a video clip

To activate the video function, select **Menu** > **Media** > **Video**; or, if the camera function is on, scroll left or right.

To start the video recording, select **Record**; to pause the recording, select **Pause**; to resume the recording, select **Continue**; to stop the recording, select **Stop**.

The phone saves the video clips on the memory card, if available, or in the phone memory.

Camera and video options

To use a filter, select **Options** > **Effects**.

To adapt the camera to the light conditions, select **Options** > **White balance**.

To change other camera and video settings and to select the image and video storage, select **Options** > **Settings**.

Music player

Your phone includes a music player for listening to music tracks or other MP3 or AAC sound files that you have downloaded from the web or transferred to the phone with Nokia PC Suite. See "Nokia PC Suite", p. 37. You can also view your recorded or downloaded video clips.

Music and video files stored in the music folder in the phone memory or on the memory card are automatically detected and added to the music library.

To open the music player, select **Menu > Media > Music player**.

Music menu

Access your music and video files stored in the phone memory or on the memory card, download music or video clips from the web, or view compatible video streams from a network server (network service).

To listen to music or play a video clip, select a file from **Playlists**, **Artists**, **Albums**, or **Genres**, and select **Play**.

To download files from the web, select **Options** > **Downloads** and a download site.

To update the music library after you have added files, select **Options** > **Update library**.

Create a playlist

To create a playlist with your selection of music, do the following:

- 1. Select **Playlists** > **Create playlist**, and enter the name of the playlist.
- 2. Add music or video clips from the displayed lists.
- 3. Select **Done** to store the playlist.

Configure a streaming service

You may receive the streaming settings as a configuration message from the service provider. <u>See "Configuration setting service"</u>, p. 9. You can also enter the settings manually. <u>See "Configuration"</u>, p. 41.

To activate the settings, do the following:

 Select Options > Downloads > Streaming settings > Configuration.

- Select a service provider, Default, or Personal config. for streaming.
- Select Account and a streaming service account from the active configuration settings.

Play music tracks

Warning: Listen to music at a moderate level. Continuous exposure to high volume may damage your hearing. Do not hold the device near your ear when the loudspeaker is in use, because the volume may be extremely loud.

To adjust the volume level, press the volume keys of the phone.

Operate the music player with the music player keys or similarly with the virtual keys on the display.

To start or pause playing, press |

To skip to the next track, press . To skip to the beginning of the previous track, press . twice.

To fast forward the current track, press and hold . To rewind the current track, press and hold . Release the key at the position you want to continue the music playback.

To stop the music player, press and hold the end key.

In the music player menu, you can use the following shortcuts:

To switch to the music menu, select ==.

Media

To switch to the current playlist, select [...].

Change the music player look

Your phone provides several themes to change the look of the music player.

Select Menu > Media > Music player > Go to Music player > Options > Settings > Music player theme and one of the listed themes. The virtual keys may change depending on the theme.

Radio

The FM radio depends on an antenna other than the wireless device antenna. A compatible headset or enhancement needs to be attached to the device for the FM radio to function properly.

Warning: Listen to music at a moderate level. Continuous exposure to high volume may damage your hearing. Do not hold the device near your ear when the loudspeaker is in use, because the volume may be extremely loud.

Select Menu > Media > Radio.

To adjust the volume, press the volume keys.

To use the graphical keys \triangle , \neg , \triangleleft , or \Longrightarrow on the display, scroll left or right to the desired key, and select it.

Tune in to radio stations Search and save stations

- 2. To save a station to a memory location, select **Options** > **Save station**.
- To enter the name of the radio station, select Options > Stations > Options > Rename.

Select **Options** and from the following:

- Search all stations to automatically search for the available stations at your location
- Set frequency to enter the frequency of the desired radio station
- Stations to list and rename or delete saved stations

Change stations

Select ___ or ___, or press the number keys corresponding to the number of the station in the station list.

Radio features

To switch off the radio, swap between headset and loudspeaker, and switch between stereo and mono output, select **Options** > **Settings**. To display information from the radio data system of the tuned in station, select **RDS on**. To enable the automatic switch to a frequency with the best reception of the tuned in station, select **Auto-freq. change on**.

Voice recorder

Record speech, sound, or an active call, and save them in **Gallery**.

Select **Menu** > **Media** > **Voice recorder**. To use the graphical keys , , , or on the display, scroll left or right.

Record sound

- Select , or, during a call, select Options >
 Record. While recording a call, all parties to the call hear a faint beeping. To pause the recording, select
 III.
- 2. To end the recording, select . The recording is saved in the Recordings folder in Gallery.

Select **Options** to play or send the last recording, to access the list of recordings, or to select the memory and the folder to store the recordings.

Equaliser

Adjust the sound when using the music player.

Select Menu > Media > Equaliser.

To activate a predefined equaliser set, scroll to one of the sets, and select **Activate**.

Create a new equaliser set

Select one of the last two sets in the list and **Options** > **Fdit**.

- 2. Scroll left or right to access the virtual sliders and up or down to adjust the slider.
- To save the settings and create a name for the set, select Save and Options > Rename.

Stereo widening

Stereo widening creates a wider stereo sound effect when you are using a stereo headset.

To activate, select **Menu** > **Media** > **Stereo widening**.

15. Web

You can access various internet services with your phone browser. The appearance of the internet pages may vary due to screen size. You may not be able to see all the details on the internet pages.

Important: Use only services that you trust and that offer adequate security and protection against barmful software.

For the availability of these services, pricing, and instructions, contact your service provider.

You may receive the configuration settings required for browsing as a configuration message from your service provider.

To set up the service, select **Menu** > **Web** > **Web settings** > **Configuration sett.**, a configuration, and an account.

Connect to a service

To make a connection to the service, select **Menu** > **Web** > **Home**; or in the standby mode, press and hold **0**.

To select a bookmark, select **Menu** > **Web** > **Bookmarks**.

To select the last URL, select **Menu** > **Web** > **Last web** addr..

To enter an address of a service, select **Menu** > **Web** > **Go to address**. Enter the address, and select **OK**.

After you make a connection to the service, you can start browsing its pages. The function of the phone keys may vary in different services. Follow the text guides on the phone display. For more information, contact your service provider.

Appearance settings

While browsing the web, select **Options** > **Settings**. The available options may include the following:

- Display Select the font size, whether images are shown, and how the text is displayed.
- General Select whether web addresses are sent as Unicode (UTF-8), the encoding type for the contents, and whether JavaScript is enabled.

Cache memory

A cache is a memory location that is used to store data temporarily. If you have tried to access or have accessed confidential information requiring passwords, empty the cache after each use. The information or services you have accessed are stored in the cache.

A cookie is data that a site saves in the cache memory of your phone. Cookies are saved until you clear the cache memory.

To clear the cache while browsing, select **Options** > **Tools** > **Clear the cache**. To allow or prevent the phone from receiving cookies, select **Menu** > **Web** > **Web settings** > **Security** > **Cookies**; or, while browsing, select **Options** > **Settings** > **Security** > **Cookies**.

Browser security

Security features may be required for some services, such as banking services or online shopping. For such connections you need security certificates and possibly a security module which may be available on your SIM card. For more information, contact your service provider.

To view or change the security module settings, or to view a list of authority or user certificates downloaded to your phone, select Menu > Settings > Security > Security module sett., Authority certificates, or User certificates.

Important: Even if the use of certificates makes the risks involved in remote connections and software installation considerably smaller, they must be used correctly in order to benefit from increased security. The existence of a certificate does not offer any protection by itself; the certificate manager must contain correct, authentic, or trusted certificates for increased security to be available. Certificates have a restricted lifetime. If

"Expired certificate" or "Certificate not valid yet" is shown, even if the certificate should be valid, check that the current date and time in your device are correct.

16. Organiser

Alarm clock

To sound an alarm at a desired time.

Set the alarm

- 1. Select Menu > Organiser > Alarm clock.
- 2. Set the alarm on, and enter the alarm time.
- 3. To issue an alarm on selected days of the week, select **Repeat:** > **On** and the days.
- 4. Select the alarm tone. If you select the radio as the alarm tone, connect the headset to the phone.
- 5. Set the snooze time-out, and select **Save**.

Stop the alarm

To stop the sounding alarm, select **Stop**. If you let the alarm sound for a minute or select **Snooze**, the alarm stops for the snooze time-out, then resumes.

Calendar

Select Menu > Organiser > Calendar.

The current day is framed. If there are any notes set for the day, the day is in bold type. To view the day notes, select **View**. To view a week, select **Options** > **Week view**. To delete all notes in the calendar, select **Options** > **Delete notes** > **All notes**.

To set the date, time, time zone, date or time format, date separator, default view, or the first day of the week, select **Options** > **Settings** and from the available options. To delete old notes automatically after a specified time, select **Options** > **Settings** > **Auto-delete notes** and from the available options.

Make a calendar note

Scroll to the date, and select **Options** > **Make a note**. Select the note type, and fill in the fields.

To-do list

To save a note for a task that you must do, select **Menu > Organiser > To-do list**.

To make a note if no note is added, select **Add**; otherwise, select **Options** > **Add**. Fill in the fields, and select **Save**.

To view a note, scroll to it, and select **View**.

Notes

To write and send notes, select Menu > Organiser > Notes.

To make a note if no note is added, select **Add**; otherwise, select **Options** > **Make a note**. Write the note, and select **Save**.

Calculator

The calculator in your phone provides a standard, a scientific, and a loan calculator.

Select **Menu** > **Organiser** > **Calculator** and from the available options, the calculator type and the operating instructions.

This calculator has limited accuracy and is designed for simple calculations.

Countdown timer

Normal timer

- To activate the timer, select Menu > Organiser >
 Countd. timer > Normal timer, enter a time, and
 write a note that is displayed when the time expires.
 To change the time, select Change time.
- 2. To start the timer, select **Start**.
- 3. To stop the timer, select **Stop timer**.

Interval timer

- To have an interval timer with up to 10 intervals started, first enter the intervals.
- Select Menu > Organiser > Countd. timer > Interval timer.
- 3. To start the timer, select **Start timer** > **Start**.

To select how the interval timer should start the next period, select **Menu** > **Organiser** > **Countd. timer** >

Settings > **Contin. to next period** and from the available options.

Stopwatch

You can measure time, take intermediate times, or take lap times using the stopwatch.

Select **Menu** > **Organiser** > **Stopwatch** and from the following options:

- Split timing to take intermediate times. To reset the time without saving it, select Options > Reset.
- Lap timing to take lap times
- Continue to view the timing that you have set in the background
- Show last to view the most recently measured time if the stopwatch is not reset
- View times or Delete times to view or delete the saved times

To set the stopwatch timing in the background, press the end key.

Dictionary

In **Dictionary**, you can look up a Chinese word for English translation, and look up an English word for Chinese translation.

- 1. Select Menu > Organiser > Dictionary.
- 2. Switch to the desired input mode if necessary.
- 3. Enter the Chinese or English word.

Organiser

4. Scroll to the desired word in the displayed list of words, and select it to view the translation.

To look up synonyms or antonyms of an English word, select **Options** > **Synonyms** or **Options** > **Antonyms**.

To view the translation of the previous or next word in the displayed list of words, scroll left or right.

Some data of the dictionary application are stored on the memory card in the dictionary folder. If you need to change the card, use the data storage function to save the data on your PC. Then transfer the data back to the new inserted card. If it is not possible to save the data from the card to your PC, check www.nokia.com.hk/support to download the dictionary data.

17. Applications

Your phone may have some games or applications installed. These files are stored in the phone memory or on a memory card and may be arranged in folders. <u>See</u> "Memory card", p. 44.

Launch an application

Select Menu > Applications > Games, Memory card, or Collection. Scroll to a game or an application, and select Open.

To set sounds, lights, and shakes for a game, select Menu > Applications > Options > Application settings.

Other available options may include the following:

- Update version to verify that a new version of the application is available for download from the web (network service)
- Web page to provide further information or additional data for the application from an internet page (network service), if available
- Application access to restrict the application from accessing the network

Download an application

Your phone supports J2ME Java applications. Ensure that the application is compatible with your phone before downloading it.

Important: Only install and use applications and other software from trusted sources, such as applications that are Symbian Signed or have passed the Java Verified™ testing.

You can download new applications and games in different ways.

- Select Menu > Applications > Options >
 Downloads > App. downloads or Game
 downloads; the list of available bookmarks is shown.
- Use the Nokia Application Installer from PC Suite to download the applications to your phone.

18. SIM services

Your SIM card may provide additional services. You can access this menu only if it is supported by your SIM card. The name and contents of the menu depend on the available services.

To show the confirmation messages sent between your phone and the network when you are using the SIM services, select Menu > Settings > Phone > Confirm SIM actions

Accessing these services may involve sending messages or making a phone call for which you may be charged.

- Installation of any complex car enhancements must be made by qualified personnel only.

Important: Battery talk and stand-by times are estimates and only possible under optimal network conditions. Actual battery talk and standby times depend on SIM cards, features used, battery age and condition, temperatures to which battery is exposed, network conditions, and many other factors, and may be significantly shorter than those specified above. Ringing tones, hands free call handling, use in digital mode, and other features will also consume the battery, and the amount of time a device is used for calls will affect its stand-by time. Likewise, the amount of time that the device is turned on and in the standby mode will affect its talk time.

Battery

Battery and charger information

Your device is powered by a rechargeable battery. The battery intended for use with this device is BL-5CT. This device is intended for use when supplied with power from the following chargers: AC-3. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, replace the battery. Use only Nokia approved batteries, and recharge your battery only with Nokia approved chargers designated for this device. Use of an unapproved battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard.

The exact charger model number may vary depending on the type of plug. The plug variant is identified by one of the following: E, EB, X, AR, U, A, C, or UB. For example, the model numbers for the charger can be, among others, AC-3C, AC-3U, AC-3X etc.

If a battery is being used for the first time or if the battery has not been used for a prolonged period, it may be necessary to connect the charger, then disconnect and reconnect it to begin charging the battery. If the battery is completely discharged, it may take several minutes before the charging indicator appears on the display or before any calls can be made.

Always switch the device off and disconnect the charger before removing the battery.

Unplug the charger from the electrical plug and the device when not in use. Do not leave a fully charged battery connected to a charger, since overcharging may shorten its lifetime. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.

Always try to keep the battery between 15°C and 25°C (59°F and 77°F). Extreme temperatures reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily. Battery performance is particularly limited in temperatures well below freezing.

Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short-circuiting can occur when a metallic object such as a coin, clip, or pen causes direct connection of the positive (+) and negative (-) terminals of the battery. (These look like metal strips on the battery.) This might happen, for example, when you carry a spare battery in your pocket or purse. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the connecting object.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire as they may explode. Batteries may also explode if damaged. Dispose of batteries according to local regulations. Please recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household waste.

Do not dismantle, cut, open, crush, bend, deform, puncture, or shred cells or batteries. In the event of a

battery leak, do not allow the liquid to come in contact with the skin or eyes. In the event of such a leak, flush your skin or eyes immediately with water, or seek medical help.

Do not modify, remanufacture, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, or immerse or expose it to water or other liquids.

Improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard. If the device or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, and you believe the battery has been damaged, take it to a service centre for inspection before continuing to use it.

Use the battery only for its intended purpose. Never use any charger or battery that is damaged. Keep your battery out of the reach of small children

Nokia battery authentication guidelines

Always use original Nokia batteries for your safety. To check that you are getting an original Nokia battery, purchase it from an authorised Nokia dealer, and inspect the hologram label using the following steps:

Successful completion of the steps is not a total assurance of the authenticity of the battery. If you have any reason to believe that your battery is not an authentic, original Nokia battery, you should refrain from using it, and take it to the nearest authorised Nokia service point or dealer for assistance. Your authorised Nokia service point or dealer will inspect the battery for authenticity. If

authenticity cannot be verified, return the battery to the place of purchase.

Authenticate hologram

- When you look at the hologram on the label, you should see the Nokia connecting hands symbol from one angle and the Nokia Original Enhancements logo when looking from another angle.
- 2. When you angle the hologram left, right, down and up, you should see 1, 2, 3 and 4 dots on each side respectively.





What if your battery is not authentic?

If you cannot confirm that your Nokia battery with the hologram on the label is an authentic Nokia battery, please do not use the battery. Take it to the nearest authorised Nokia service point or dealer for assistance. The use of a battery that is not approved by the

manufacturer may be dangerous and may result in poor performance and damage to your device and its enhancements. It may also invalidate any approval or warranty applying to the device.

Care and maintenance

Your device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The following suggestions will help you protect your warranty coverage.

- Keep the device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and all types of liquids or moisture can contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If your device does get wet, remove the battery, and allow the device to dry completely before replacing it.
- Do not use or store the device in dusty, dirty areas. Its moving parts and electronic components can be damaged.
- Do not store the device in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the device in cold areas. When the device returns to its normal temperature, moisture can form inside the device and damage electronic circuit boards.
- Do not attempt to open the device other than as instructed in this guide.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards and fine mechanics.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the device.

- Do not paint the device. Paint can clog the moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Use a soft, clean, dry cloth to clean any lenses, such as camera, proximity sensor, and light sensor lenses.
- Use only the supplied or an approved replacement antenna. Unauthorised antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the device and may violate regulations governing radio devices.
- · Use chargers indoors.
- Always create a backup of data you want to keep, such as contacts and calendar notes.
- To reset the device from time to time for optimum performance, power off the device and remove the battery.

These suggestions apply equally to your device, battery, charger, or any enhancement. If any device is not working properly, take it to the nearest authorised service facility for service.

Additional safety information Small children

Your device and its enhancements may contain small parts. Keep them out of the reach of small children.

Operating environment

This device meets RF exposure guidelines when used either in the normal use position against the ear or when positioned at least 1 centimetres (3/8 inches) away from the body. When a carry case, belt clip, or holder is used for body-worn operation, it should not contain metal and should position the device the above-stated distance from your body.

To transmit data files or messages, this device requires a quality connection to the network. In some cases, transmission of data files or messages may be delayed until such a connection is available. Ensure the above separation distance instructions are followed until the transmission is completed.

Medical devices

Operation of any radio transmitting equipment, including wireless phones, may interfere with the functionality of inadequately protected medical devices. Consult a physician or the manufacturer of the medical device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external

RF energy or if you have any questions. Switch off your device in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

Implanted medical devices

Manufacturers of medical devices recommend that a minimum separation of 15.3 centimetres (6 inch) should be maintained between a wireless device and an implanted medical device, such as a pacemaker or implanted cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the medical device. Persons who have such devices should:

- Always keep the wireless device more than 15.3 centimetres (6 inch) from the medical device when the wireless device is turned on.
- Not carry the wireless device in a breast pocket.
- Hold the wireless device to the ear opposite the medical device to minimise the potential for interference.
- Turn the wireless device off immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.
- Read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of their implanted medical device.

If you have any questions about using your wireless device with an implanted medical device, consult your health care provider.

Hearing aids

Some digital wireless devices may interfere with some hearing aids. If interference occurs, consult your service provider.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles such as electronic fuel injection systems, electronic antiskid (antilock) braking systems, electronic speed control systems, and air bag systems. For more information, check with the manufacturer, or its representative, of your vehicle or any equipment that has been added.

Only qualified personnel should service the device or install the device in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty that may apply to the device. Check regularly that all wireless device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the device, its parts, or enhancements. For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that air bags inflate with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If

in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

Using your device while flying in aircraft is prohibited. Switch off your device before boarding an aircraft. The use of wireless teledevices in an aircraft may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft, disrupt the wireless telephone network, and may be illegal.

Potentially explosive environments

Switch off your device when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and obey all signs and instructions. Potentially explosive atmospheres include areas where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. Switch off the device at refuelling points such as near gas pumps at service stations. Observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots, storage, and distribution areas: chemical plants; or where blasting operations are in progress. Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include below deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities and areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders. You should check with the manufacturers of vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) to determine if this device can be safely used in their vicinity.

Emergency calls

Important: This device operates using radio signals, wireless networks, landline networks, and user-programmed functions. If your device supports voice calls over the internet (internet calls), activate both the internet calls and the cellular phone. The device will attempt to make emergency calls over both the cellular networks and through your internet call provider if both are activated. Connections in all conditions cannot be guaranteed. You should never rely solely on any wireless device for essential communications like medical emergencies.

To make an emergency call:

- If the device is not on, switch it on. Check for adequate signal strength. Depending on your device, you may also need to complete the following:
 - Insert a SIM card if your device uses one
 - Remove certain call restrictions you have activated in your device.
 - Change your profile from offline or flight profile mode to an active profile.
- 2. Press the end key as many times as needed to clear the display and ready the device for calls.
- 3. Enter the official emergency number for your present location. Emergency numbers vary by location.
- 4. Press the call key.

When making an emergency call, give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. Your wireless device may be the only means of communication at the scene of an accident. Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

CERTIFICATION INFORMATION (SAR)

This mobile device meets guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure guidelines for mobile devices employ a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate or SAR. The SAR limit stated in the ICNIRP guidelines is 2.0 watts/kilogram (W/kg) averaged over 10 grams of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The actual SAR level of an operating device can be below the maximum value because the device is designed to use only the power required to reach the network. That amount changes depending on a number of factors such as how close you are to a network base station. The highest SAR value under the ICNIRP guidelines for use of the device at the ear is 1.01 W/kg.
